OUR MISSION

Founded in 1991, the Colorado Children's Immunization Coalition (CCIC) is a statewide 501(c)3 nonprofit that strategically mobilizes diverse partners and families to advance children's health through immunizations.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It is hard to imagine the tremendous growth and impact CCIC experienced in 2014 and 2015 without considering the support and partnership of our growing coalition members, our increasingly diverse funders and sponsors and our access to and reliance on Colorado's growing number of world-renowned vaccine experts. Through an increased focus on vaccine policy, outreach to parents and local communities, and the expansion of our provider education and coalition building opportunities, CCIC solidified its vital role as Colorado's only statewide independent nonprofit organization dedicated to children's immunizations.

2014 marked the achievement of significant milestones for CCIC. In addition to leading advocacy efforts to implement new Board of Health exemption rules and increase state funding for the immunization registry by \$1.2 million, we reached over 1 million Coloradans with marketing and outreach efforts, educated more than 1,000 healthcare providers on

immunization research and guidelines, and launched new initiatives including convening the data advisory council, hosting our first immunization summit, and participating in a new Denver Metro HPV alliance.

Our funders rewarded this great success with new and generous awards including unsolicited grants and donations.

Many thanks to the countless parents, public health officials, health care professionals, policy makers and advocates involved in the success we have achieved in 2014-15 and beyond.

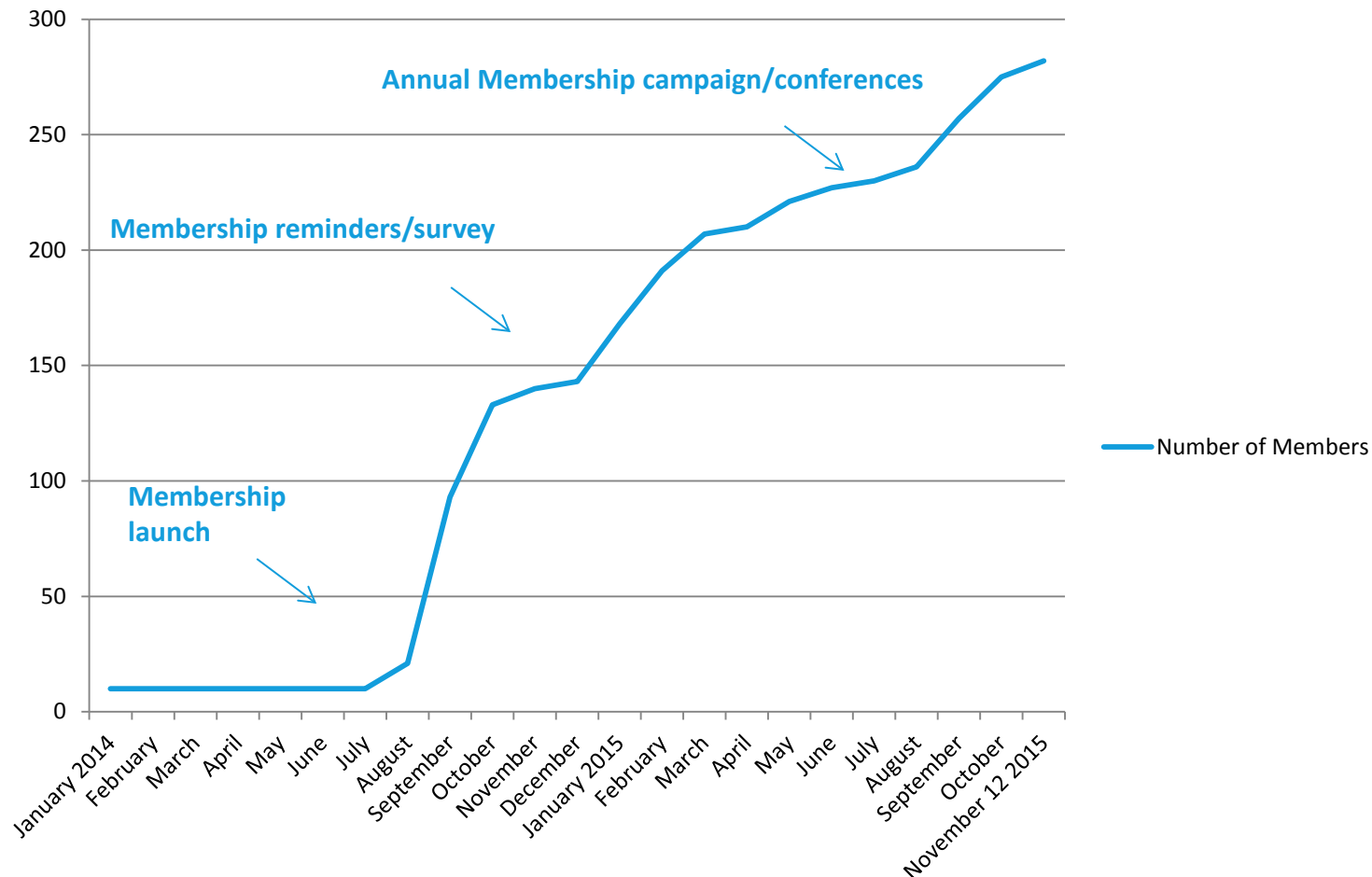

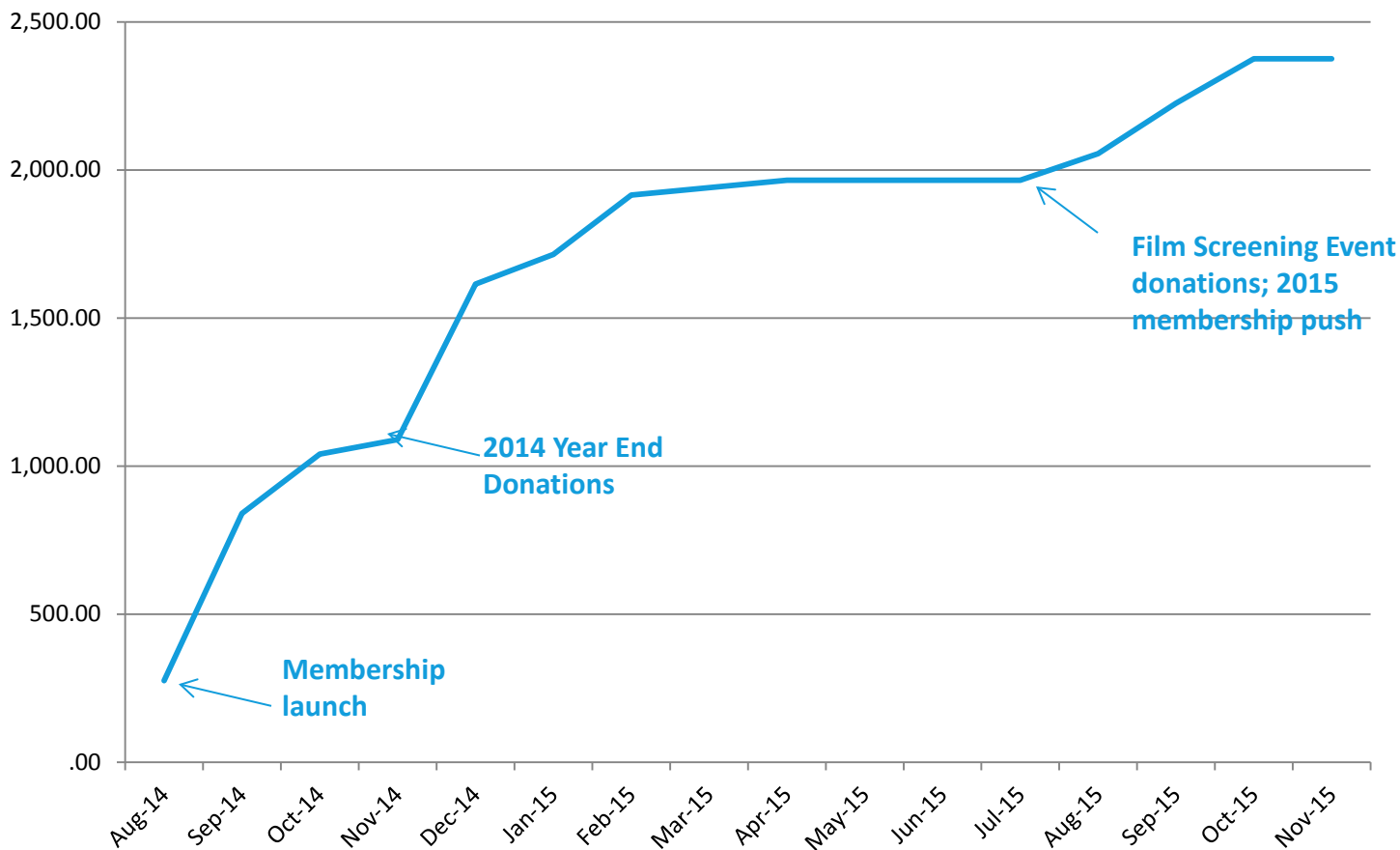

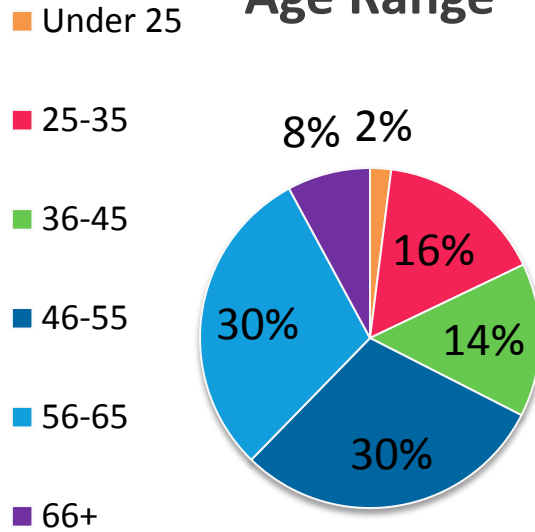


CCIC Member Donations

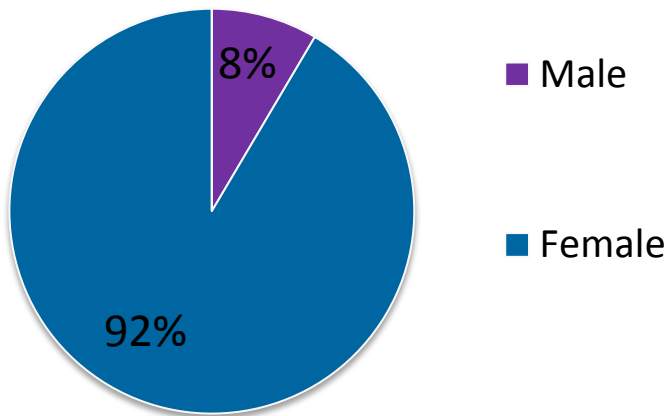


2015 Member Demographics

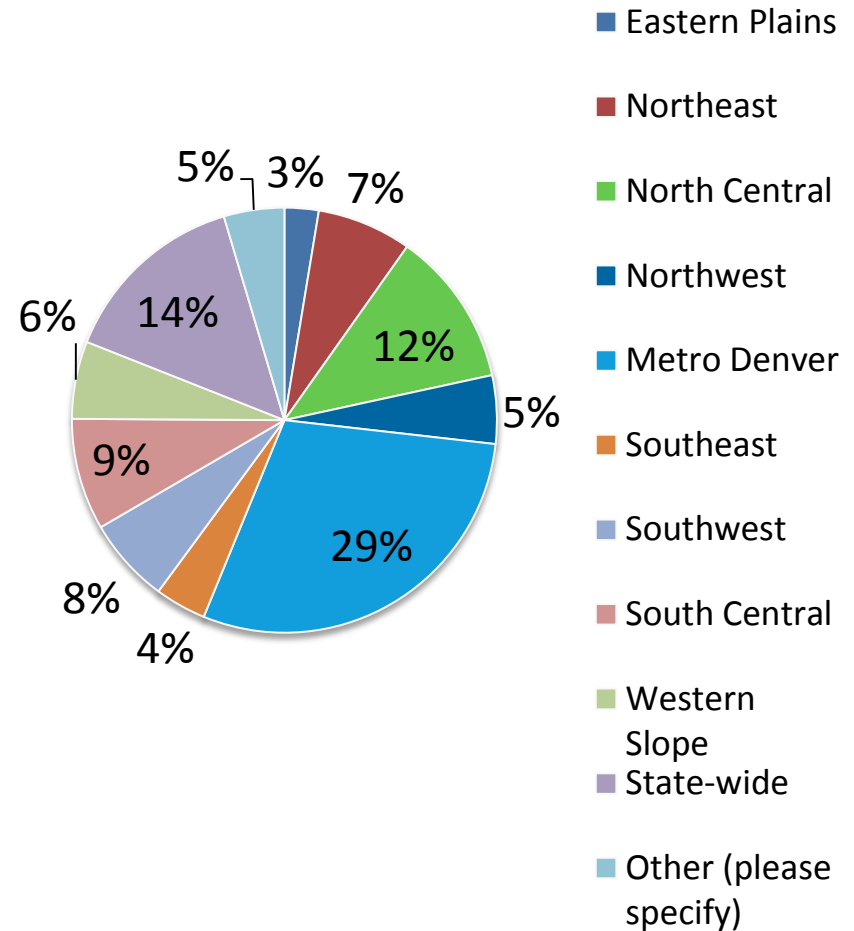
Age Range



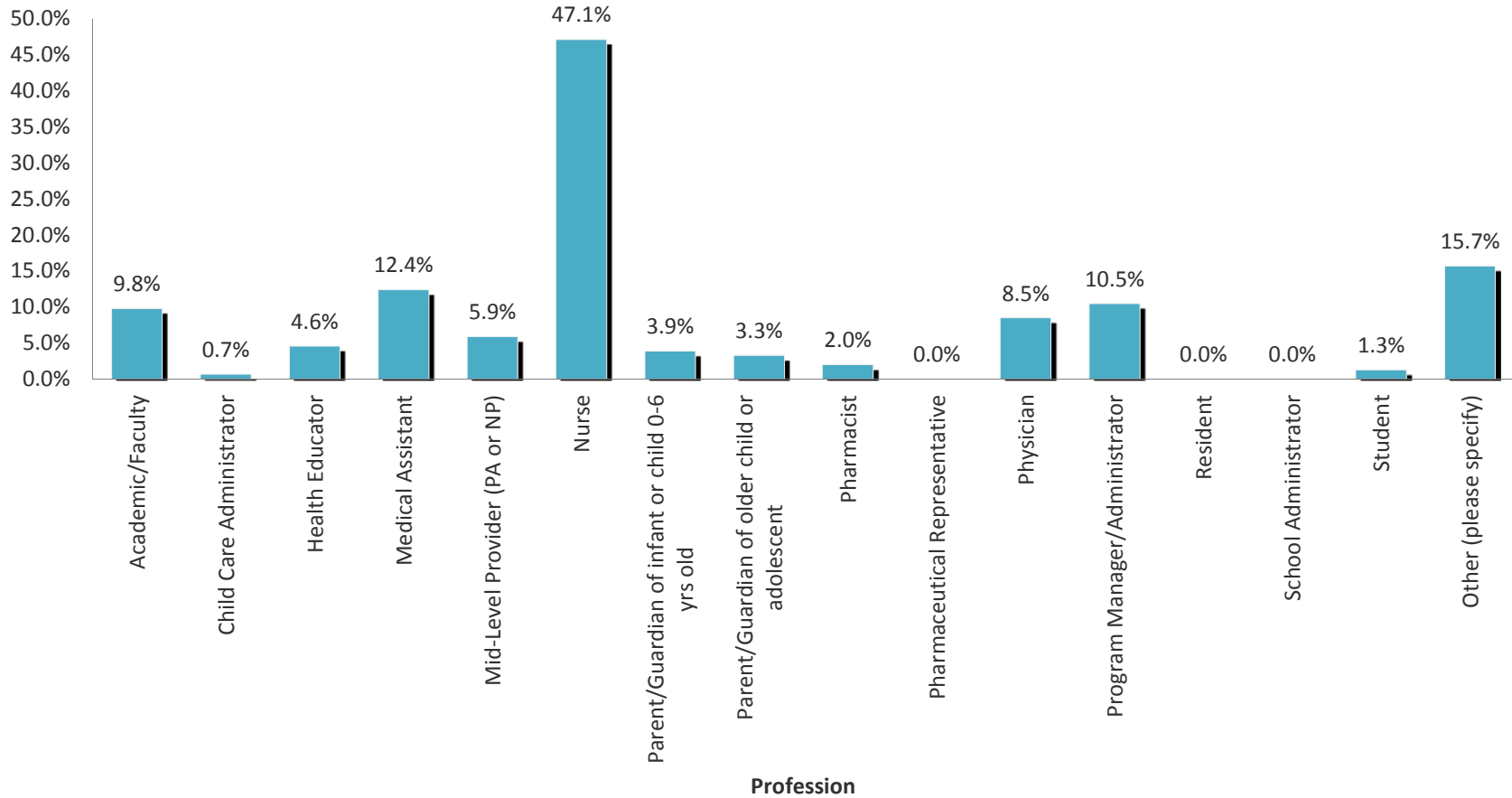
What is your gender?

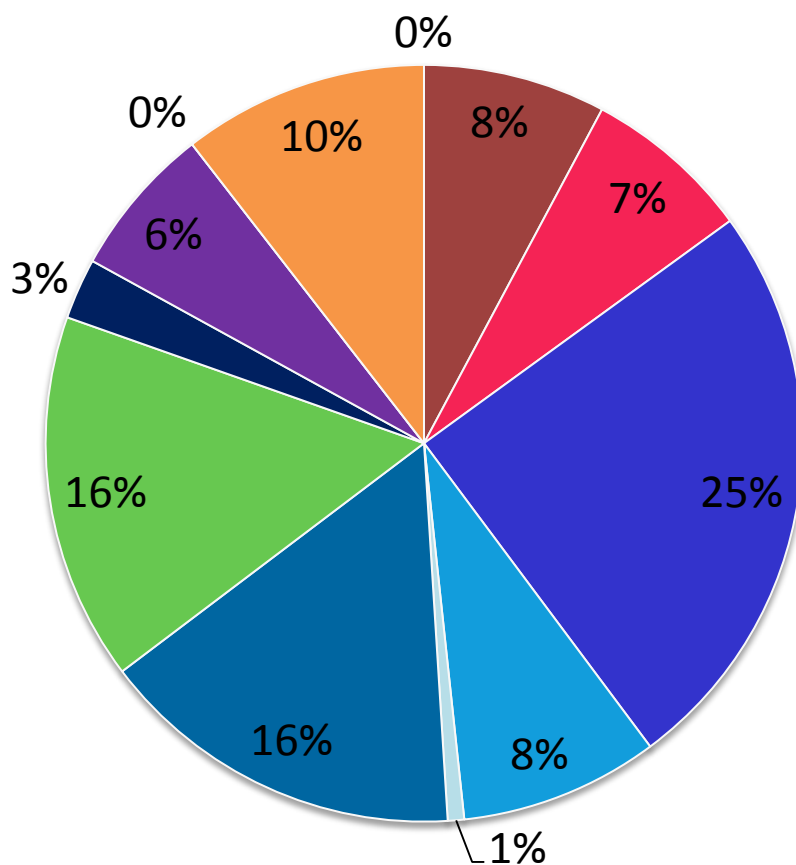


2015 Membership Composition: Profession

DENVER METRO ALLIANCE FOR HPV PREVENTION

The Alliance aims to increase HPV vaccination rates in Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, Douglas and Jefferson counties through four approaches:

1. Forming an Advisory Council to promote and champion HPV vaccine education, promotion and awareness
2. Developing sustainable infrastructure to measure HPV vaccination rates and CIIS penetration
3. Developing and implementing a provider intervention to increase adherence to national HPV vaccination guidelines
4. Developing and implementing a targeted communications plan to increase knowledge about the demand for the HPV vaccine among parents/guardians of adolescents aged 11 to 17 years



In 2015, CCIC formed an **Immunization Data Advisory Council** to serve as a collaboration of Colorado immunization and immunization-related data experts to address gaps in access to local, school, and childcare level data.

IDAC VISION: Immunization data will be publicly available at the county, school and childcare levels to better inform immunization policy, research, programs and parental decision making.

.....➔ Acquired **\$99,500 in grant funding** from the Kaiser Permanente Community Health Fund, a fund of the Denver Foundation to support initiative over two years

.....➔ CDPHE shared map of county level coverage rates at the CO Immunization Summit for participants with discussion of data limitations

.....➔ Hosted first two bimonthly meetings as a forum to review the landscape of what is already being done in CO and other states, to establish goals, share resources and expertise, and to create an action plan to guide the future direction of the initiative

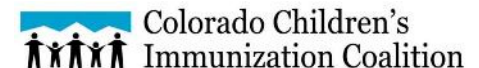
EVERY LAST CHILD Documentary Screening

In 2014 and 2015, CCIC continued to offer quality, evidence-based presentations to health care professionals on the latest hot topics on emerging immunization research, best practices, recommendations, and vaccine delivery to strengthen provider practices in Colorado.

.....> CCIC hosted **20+ educational seminars** each year addressing issues of importance related to childhood immunizations and their role in keeping Colorado kids healthy

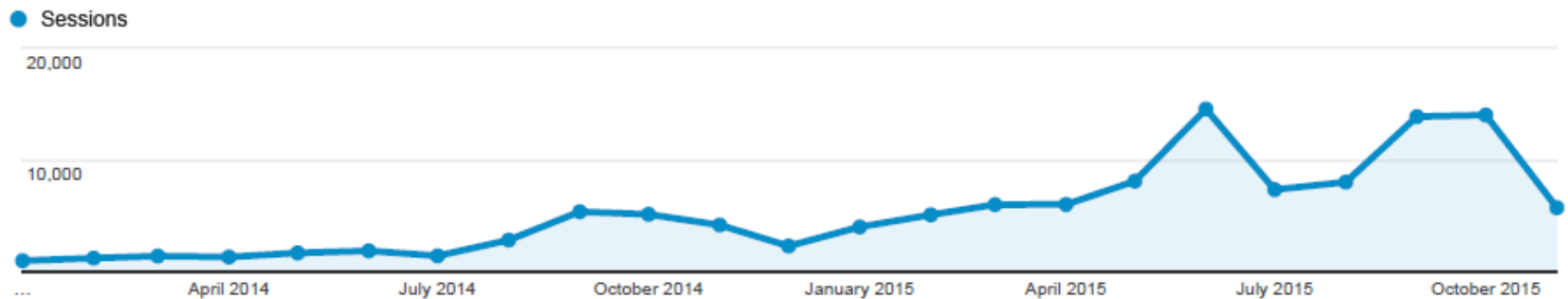

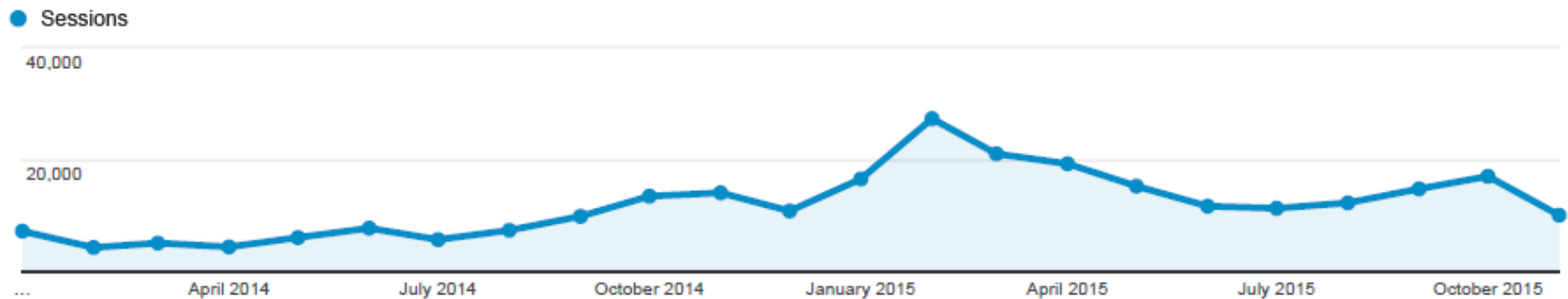

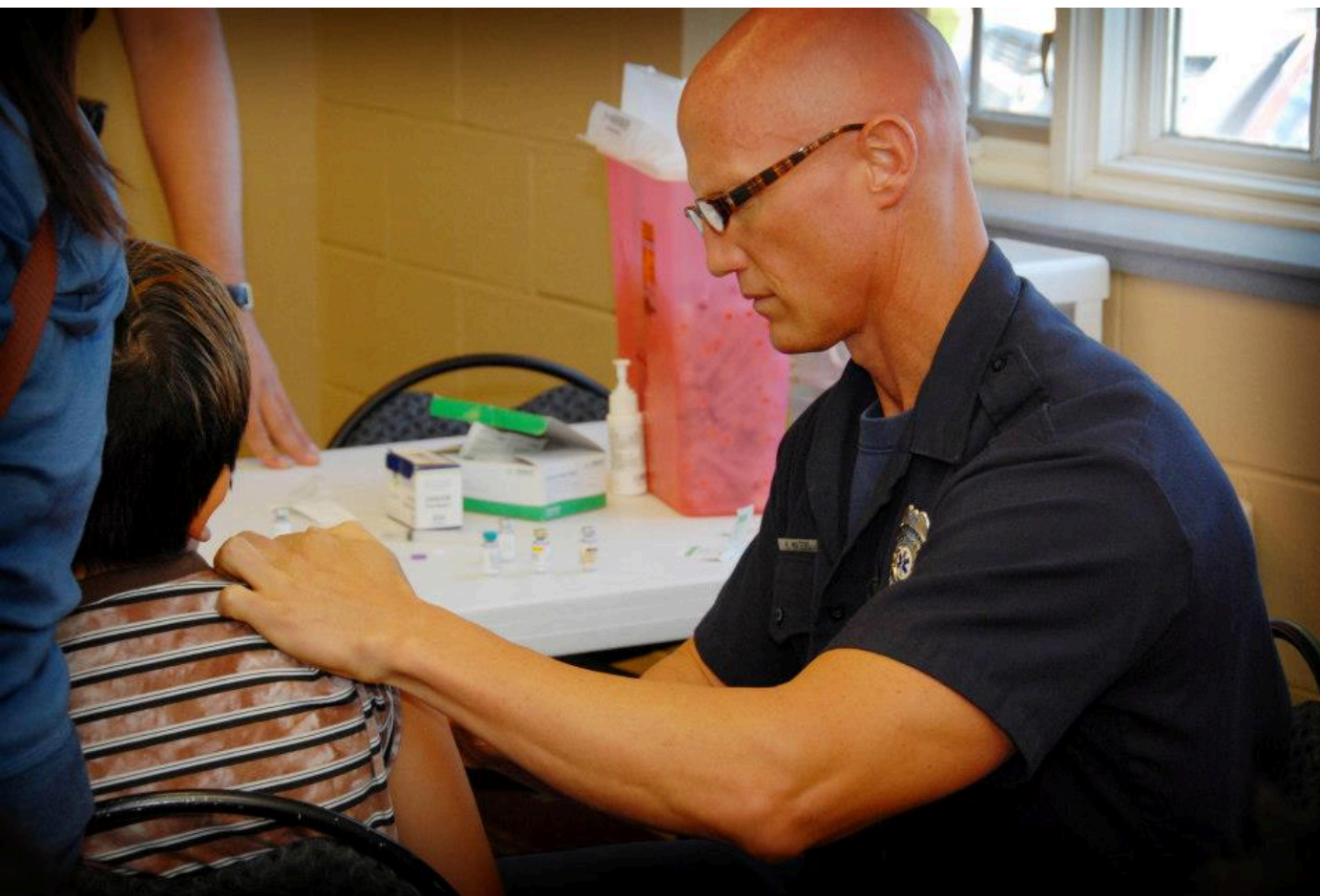

In 2014, CCIC had an outstanding year at the Legislature, as we initiated and led a diverse coalition to support a key policy initiative concerning personal belief exemptions. Ultimately, this resulted in the passage of HB 14-1288: "Concerning Personal Belief Exemptions for School Required Immunizations," which took effect July 1, 2014. Additionally, CCIC served on the SB 13-222 Vaccine Access Taskforce and continues to serve and staff the steering committee in support of implementing the taskforce recommendation

.....> Spearheaded passage and implementation of **House Bill 14-1288**, which creates data transparency for parents and others requesting immunization and exemption rates at child care centers and schools

.....> Identified more than **30 organizations** to demonstrate support for the passage of House Bill 14-1288

.....> Received grant to support implementation of the **Senate Bill 222 Vaccine Access Task Force**

.....> Received extensive local and national media attention from over **100 media outlets**

-> Led a stakeholder engagement process to recommend enhancements and expansion to the Colorado Immunization Information System
-> Submitted a formal letter to the Colorado Board of Health urging alignment of Colorado's school-required vaccines schedule with Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommendations
-> Hired a contracted research and policy analyst



Governor Hickenlooper signed into law HB 14-1288 during a May 21, 2014 ceremony at Children's Hospital Colorado.



In 2015, CCIC had another banner year advancing immunization policy in Colorado. These successes included the adoption of new Board of Health rules in support of the implementation of HB14-1288. Also, the Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS) and Local Public Health Departments received increased general fund dollars. In addition, CCIC is managing a pilot project in support of the SB13-222 Vaccine Access Taskforce's effort to evaluate business solutions designed to alleviate some of the most common barriers in vaccination service delivery.

-➔ Led strong coalition in support of Board of Health rules to increase the **frequency of non-medical exemptions** for school-required immunizations and the **annual collection and public disclosure of school and daycare immunization and exemption rates**
-➔ Executed a comprehensive communication and outreach plan resulting in positive **media coverage** and numerous supportive written and oral **public testimony** submitted in support of the proposed rules
-➔ Secured **\$1.2 million** in funding for Colorado Immunization Information System in the FY 15/16 budget
-➔ Supported **\$500,000** in funding for Local Public Health Agencies to increase vaccine access in the FY 15/16 budget



On April 15, 2015, the Colorado Board of Health voted unanimously (6-0) to approve the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's proposed changes to the frequency and process of submitting non-medical immunization exemptions for school or child care.

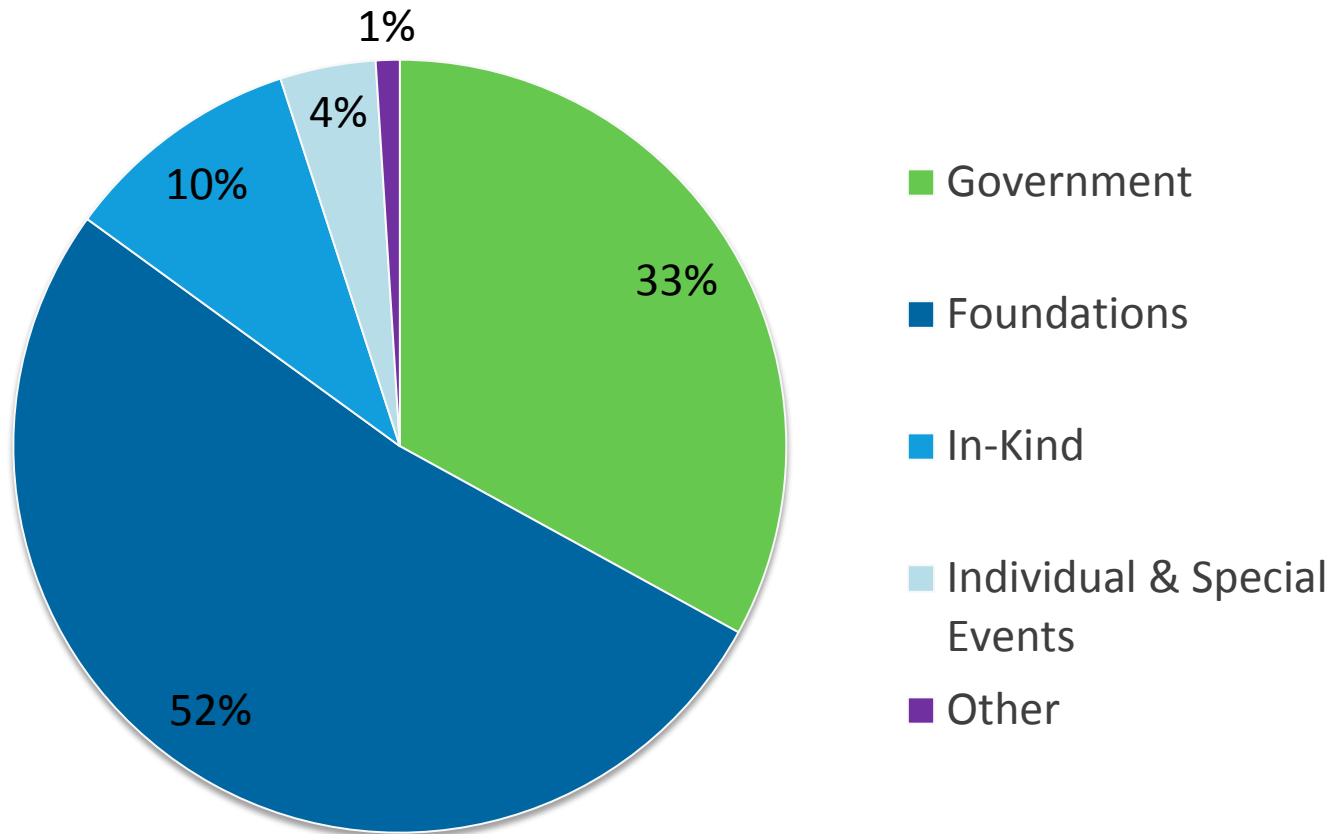

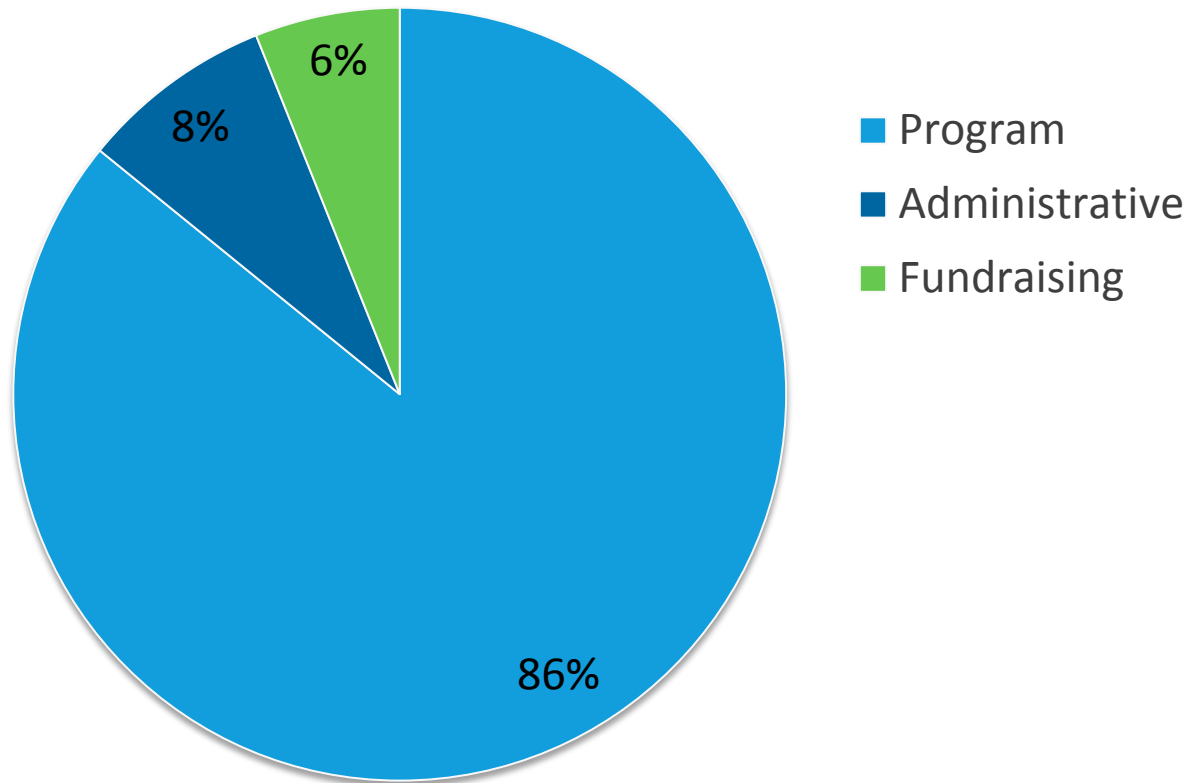

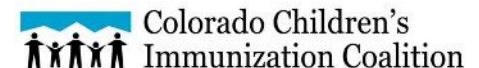
